Please consider joining the next cycle of the Eastern Group Psychotherapy Society Monthly Consultation Group, starting in October 2019. The Monthly Consultation Group supports clinicians -- seasoned, early career, and trainee -- in addressing the clinical and professional challenges faced in agencies, hospitals, and other non-private organizational settings. Consultation sessions especially **focus on group process and theory, and on navigating the unique challenges of working in agencies and other organizations.**

The group, **a project of the EGPS Social Action Committee**, offers an excellent opportunity for clinicians and trainees to enrich their work and learning. The co-leaders are two senior EGPS group leaders and supervisors, **Lee Kassan and Anne McEneaney** (see reverse for leader bios).

This is a not-for-profit EGPS sponsored activity and the fee for this program is **\$20/session for EGPS members and students, and \$25/session for non-members.**
